LOVING GOD WITH ALL OF YOUR MIND

One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" "The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these.'"

1. In our natural, sinful condition our mind chooses <u>SELF</u> over <u>GOD</u>.

Furthermore, since they did not think it worthwhile to retain the knowledge of God, he gave them over to a depraved mind, to do what ought not to be done.

Romans 1:28 (NIV)

2. The mind under the curse of <u>SIN</u> is death, the mind freed from sin is <u>LIFE</u>.

Those who live according to the sinful nature have their minds set on what that nature desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. The mind of sinful man is death, but the mind controlled by the Spirit is life and peace; the sinful mind is hostile to God. It does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so.

3. The way to loving God with all your mind is to daily <u>RENEW</u> your <u>MIND</u>.

Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is--his good, pleasing and perfect will.

Loving God with your MIND relates to <u>DISCIPLESHIP</u>.

This work must continue until we are all joined together in the same faith and in the same knowledge of the Son of God. We must become like a mature person, growing until we become like Christ and have his perfection.

1. God's <u>PURPOSE</u> for us is to become more like <u>JESUS</u>, His perfect Son.

For God knew his people in advance, and he chose them to become like his Son, so that his Son would be the firstborn, with many brothers and sisters.

2. God's <u>PLAN</u> for us is to <u>GROW UP</u> to maturity that others can see Christ in us. God wants us to grow up, to know the whole truth and tell it in love—like Christ in everything. We take our lead from Christ, who is the source of everything we do."

3. God's <u>PROCESS</u> to help us grow up includes our <u>CIRCUMSTANCES</u>.
