## **REMOVING THE POWER OF SHAME**

And the man and his wife were both naked and were not ashamed.

## THE STORY OF SHAME

Guilt – focus on behavior – "I <u>MADE</u> a mistake."

• Result: Guilt that can lead to repentance.

Shame – focus on self – "I <u>AM</u> a mistake."

• Result: Shame that leads to isolation.

For the kind of sorrow God wants us to experience leads us away from sin and results in salvation. There's no regret for that kind of sorrow. But worldly sorrow, which lacks repentance, results in spiritual death.

## THE EFFECT OF SHAME

- 1. Shame binds me to my <u>PAST</u>.
  - Shame shackles me to <u>WHO I WAS</u> to keep me from becoming <u>WHO I AM</u>.

As far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us.

Psalm 103:12

- 2. Shame distorts my <u>IDENTITY</u>. (Gen. 2:25; 3:7a, 10)
  - A heart that <u>HOARDS</u> <u>FAILURES</u> will convince me that I didn't just fail, but that I <u>AM A</u> <u>FAILURE</u>.

- 3. Shame grows stronger in <u>SECRECY</u>, <u>SECLUSION</u>, and <u>SILENCE</u>. (Gen. 3:7b, 8-9)
- 4. Shame breeds FEAR, BLAME, and DISCONNECTION. (Gen. 3:10-12)

## FLIPPING THE SCRIPT WITH GRACE

- 1. Jesus <u>BREAKS THE CHAINS</u> to our past and says you are loved and forgiven. (Gen. 3:15)
- **2.** Fear may call out our doubts, but God calls out our <u>NAME</u>. (Gen. 3:9a)
- 3. Jesus says you are not a failure; YOU ARE FAMILY.
