MAKING MAJOR ADJUSTMENTS

Then he said to them all: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. ²⁴For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will save it."

"Major Adjustments" is More Simply Stated as <u>OBEDIENCE</u>: "So why do you call me 'Lord,' when you won't obey me?"

Luke 6:46 (NLT)

- 1. First, obedience is a <u>HEART DECISION</u> as a willingness to do whatever God says.
- 2. Second, obedience is always shown by our WORDS, ACTIONS and DEEDS.
- 3. Third, obedience will usually **COST** you and those around you **SOMETHING**.
- A Man Named Elisha:

The Lord said to Elijah, "Go back the way you came, and go to the Desert of Damascus. When you get there, anoint Hazael king over Aram. ¹⁶Also, anoint Jehu son of Nimshi king over Israel, and anoint Elisha son of Shaphat from Abel Meholah to succeed you as prophet." ... ¹⁹So Elijah went from there and found Elisha son of Shaphat. He was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen, and he himself was driving the twelfth pair. Elijah went up to him and threw his cloak around him. ²⁰Elisha then left his oxen and ran after Elijah. - Making Major Adjustments in Your Life:
