I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile.

## The Person Who Wrote Romans:

Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle and set apart for the gospel of God-<sup>2</sup>the gospel he promised beforehand through his prophets in the Holy Scriptures <sup>3</sup>regarding his Son, who as to his human nature was a descendant of David, <sup>4</sup>and who through the Spirit of holiness was declared with power to be the Son of God by his resurrection from the dead: Jesus Christ our Lord. <sup>5</sup>Through him and for his name's sake, we received grace and apostleship to call people from among all the Gentiles to the obedience that comes from faith. <sup>6</sup>And you also are among those who are called to belong to Jesus Christ. <sup>7</sup>To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

Romans 1:1-7 (NIV)

- 1. Paul, the MESSENGER from the Son of God.
- 2. Paul, the MISSIONARY for the purpose of sharing God's salvation through faith.
- 3. Paul, the MINISTER of Jesus Christ to the Saints of God.

## The People of Romans:

First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is being reported all over the world. <sup>9</sup>God, whom I serve with my whole heart in preaching the gospel of his Son, is my witness how constantly I remember you <sup>10</sup>in my prayers at all times; and I pray that now at last by God's will the way may be opened for me to come to you. <sup>11</sup>I long to see you so that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to make you strong-<sup>12</sup>that is, that you and I may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith. <sup>13</sup>I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that I planned many times to come to you (but have been prevented from doing so until now) in order that I might have a harvest among you, just as I have had among the other Gentiles. <sup>14</sup>I am obligated both to Greeks and non-Greeks, both to the wise and the foolish.

Romans 1:8-14 (NIV)

- 1. These were a people of <u>GREAT FAITH</u>.
- 2. These were a people made up mostly of <u>GENTILE</u> <u>BELIEVERS</u>.
- 3. These were people that needed to <u>GROW</u> in <u>MATURITY</u> to better serve Christ.
- The Purpose of Romans:

That is why I am so eager to preach the gospel also to you who are at Rome. <sup>16</sup>I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile. <sup>17</sup>For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."

Romans 1:15-17 (NIV)

- 1. To <u>INTRODUCE</u> himself to the church meeting at Rome.
- 2. To <u>INDOCTRINATE</u> the church concerning the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
- 3. To <u>INITIATE</u> a conversation with them about helping him continue his mission.
