Why Did God Give This Commandment?

1. There are no <u>PERFECT PARENTS</u>.

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

Romans 3:23 (NIV)

2. Respect for <u>AUTHORITY</u> begins at home.

Give to everyone what you owe them: Pay your taxes and government fees to those who collect them, and give respect and honor to those in authority.

Romans 13:7 (NLT)

3. How I relate to my parents will affect every other <u>RELATIONSHIP</u> I have.

Wise children pay attention when their parents correct them, but arrogant people never admit that they are wrong.

Proverbs 13:1 (TEV)

4. Obeying this commandment promises God's <u>BLESSINGS</u> and <u>PROTECTION</u>.

"...that your days may be long upon the land the Lord you God is giving you."

Exodus 20:12 (NKJV)

- How Do I Honor My Parents?
 - 1. As a child, I honor my parents by <u>OBEYING</u> and <u>RESPECTING</u> them.

Children, obey your parents; this the right thing to do because God has placed them in authority over you.

Ephesians 6:1 (TLB)

A child who mistreats his father or mother is a public disgrace.

Proverbs 19:26 (TLB)

2. As a youth, I honor my parents by <u>ACCEPTING</u> and <u>APPRECIATING</u> them.

Be grateful for the good things that the Lord has given you and your family... Deuteronomy 26:11 (GNT) When your mother is old, show her your appreciation.

Proverbs 23:22 (GNT)

3. As an adult, I honor my parents by <u>AFFIRMING</u> and not <u>ABANDONING</u> them.

They should... put their religion in practice by caring for their own family and so repaying their parents and grandparents, for this is pleasing to God.

1 Timothy 5:4 (NIV)

If anyone does not provide for his... immediate family, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.

1 Timothy 5:8 (NIV)

A Closing Challenge about "Honoring Our Parents"

"Honor your father and mother as the Lord your God commands you."

Deuteronomy 5:16 (GW)

1. To honor them is to LOVE them.

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Now remain in my love. ¹⁰ If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love."

John 15:9-10 (NIV)

2. To honor them is to FORGIVE them.

We despised Him and rejected Him-a man of sorrows, acquainted with grief. We turned our backs on Him and looked the other way...⁵ He was wounded and bruised for our sins...⁶ God laid on Him the guilt and sins of every one of us...⁹ He had done no wrong, and has never spoken an evil word."

3. A word to parents: Be HONORABLE.

And now a word to parents: don't keep on scolding and nagging your children, making them angry and resentful. Rather bring them up with loving discipline.

4. A word to those without parents: There is a FATHER you can DEPEND on.
